PRESENTATION

Terry Easterby, Health Promoter, County of Lambton Community Health Services addressed the Board regarding the patent expiry for Oxycontin. Mr. Easterby advised that other drug manufacturers will be applying to Health Canada to manufacture and distribute oxycontin when the current patent expires November 25, 2012.

Currently, there are 1,200 people in Lambton County taking methadone for opiate addiction. Mr. Easterby is meeting with various organizations looking for support to lobby the federal government to prohibit the production of generic oxycontin.

Chair Murray Jackson advised Mr. Easterby that the Board will contact the Ontario Association of Police Services Boards to get this topic on the October 18, 2012 meeting agenda.

The Chair thanked Mr. Easterby for bringing this subject to the attention of the Lambton Group Police Services Board. Mr. Easterby left the meeting at this time.
