DETACHMENT REPORT

The following is Detachment Report from St. Sgt. Younen:

September 2012 -

- Overtime static
- Increase in Break and Enter and high-level Mischief
- One public complaint – very vague, no officer named – complaint not pursued due to lack of information
- Substantial decrease in violent crime
- Motor Vehicle Collisions slightly higher
- Two (2) fatalities; one not the result of the motor vehicle accident the decedent was injured in

- Impaired charges up over last year
- R.I.D.E. checks continuing 24/7
- Marine Unit – 90 calls for service total, 12 in September. Arrangements are being made to take the boat out of the water.
- Property Crimes down slightly
- School Resource Officers busy – 16 charges laid in September
- Crime Abatement Program continues to be a success
- There continues to be thefts from unlocked vehicles – this time in Plympton-Wyoming

MEMBER'S REPORT

R. Orcutt inquired about consequences to an individual who is forwarding inappropriate pictures of a minor through the internet.

Officers Younen and Bradley advised that once an individual posts a picture on the internet, they have lost control of where it goes from there. Other charges could result depending on distribution of the pictures, i.e. if consent is given, etc.

R. Orcutt stated that individuals using the internet should be more aware of what they are posting and how it could affect them later on.

Officer Younen advised the Board of a recent trend known as “swatting”. It refers to emails being received by police describing an event that requires police tactical teams. Upon responding, however, it is found to be a scam.

- e) St. Sgt. Younen advised the Board that the OPP are no longer providing paid duty to events such as Stag and Doe gatherings due to liability issues. Organizers may seek out private security to attend this events.
